

PROFILE OF SWPA POWER ***And Its Impact On Kansas***

More than 540,000 Kansans enjoy the benefits of clean, renewable and efficient hydropower generated at Corps of Engineers multipurpose reservoirs and marketed by the Southwestern Power Administration. SWPA power distributed to businesses and industry also supports **more than 91,000 jobs** in the state with a payroll of **almost \$1.6 billion annually**.

The power marketed by SWPA is generated at 24 Corps dams in the region. In 2001 these multipurpose projects generated **4,669 million kWh** of hydroelectricity. Of that amount, **347 million kWh** was delivered to Kansans. SWPA customers, through their electric rates, will repay more than 35 percent of the entire cost of constructing these 24 lakes — **more than \$1 billion** — *plus interest!*

SWPA power is distributed in the state by consumer-owned, not-for-profit electric systems, ranging from small municipally owned electric systems and rural electric cooperatives to the Kansas City Board of Public Utilities. This power is distributed by the following systems:
